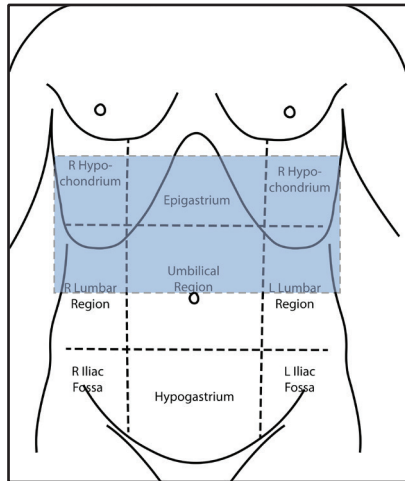


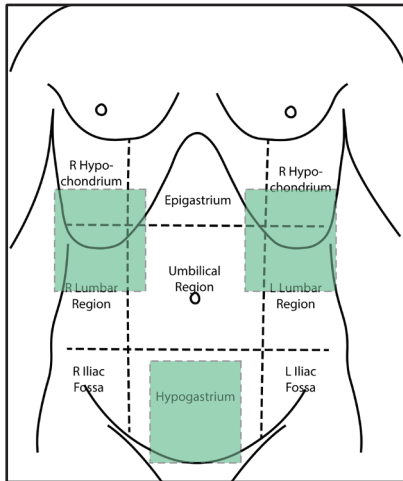
What to Request - Ultrasound

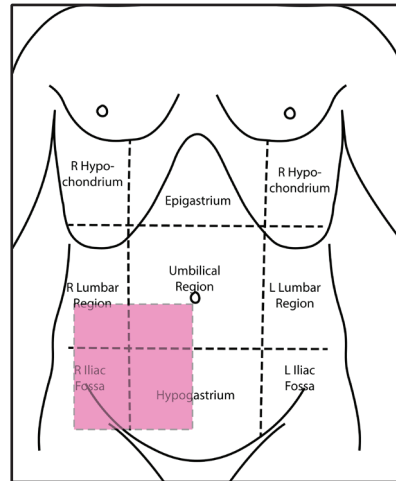
Abdomen US



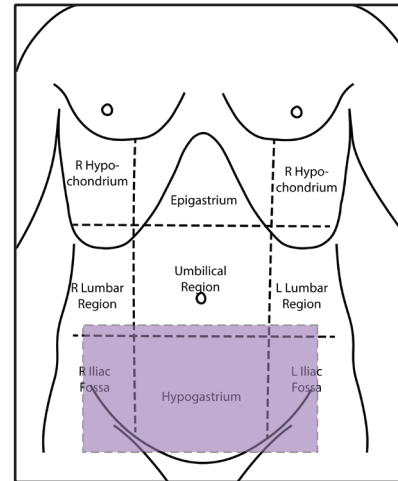
Renal/KUB US



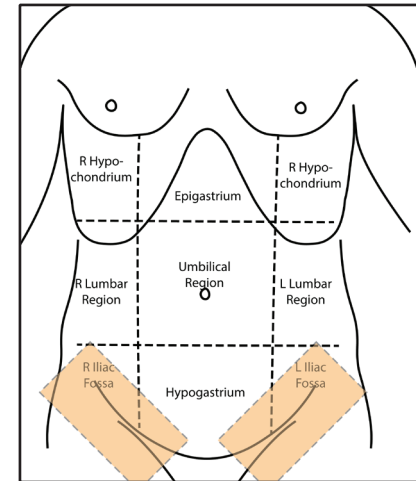
Appendix US

What is examined:
Area above the Umbilicus

Anatomy Scanned:

- ✓ Liver
- ✓ Gallbladder and Biliary System
- ✓ Spleen
- ✓ Pancreas
- ✓ Kidneys
- ✓ Aorta

What is examined:
Bladder and Kidneys

Anatomy Scanned:

- ✓ Kidneys
- ✓ Bladder (pre and post micturition volume)
- ✓ Ureteric Jets
- ✓ Prostate

What is examined:
Right Iliac Fossa

Anatomy Scanned:

- ✓ RIF
- ✓ Appendix
- ✓ Mesenteric Lymph nodes

What is examined:
Area below the Umbilicus

Anatomy Scanned:

- ✓ Uterus
- ✓ Ovaries
- ✓ Adnexa

Note:
Transvaginal may not be performed if contraindicated

What is examined:
Groin

Anatomy Scanned:

- ✓ Inguinal and Femoral Canals
- ✓ Adductors if clinically indicated
